## Say NO to 0870 and charged calls

Still pushing this one so no apologies for leaving this in . I think it is important for people to dig their heels in with these big companies especially in light of the recent enormous profits they all seem to be announcing.

When you get one of the 0870 numbers or other charged number go to [http://](http://www.saynoto0870.com/)

[www.saynoto0870.com/](http://www.saynoto0870.com/) click on the search to find alternative number on the top left green banner and see if there is any alternatives you can try before the payment option. They have alternatives listed for 0800, 0808, 0844, 0845, 0870 and 0871 numbers. Funny thing is how these companies always manage to answer the 0800 number almost immediately yet the same office leaves you waiting for ages on a payment number. The worst I have come across for this so far in my experience is Virgin, you are given a number to phone to organize a disconnection of broadband. I phoned it 4 times and was kept on their computer ansafone for 1/2 hr each time. I was also forced to listen to obnoxious

sounds they said was music which was very loud, obviously designed to drive you away and thereby preventing cancellation. I dug around, found this site and an associated 0800 number. Tried it, it was answered immediately, I assume as they are paying for it, and my cancellation organized. Out of order Virgin.
